Dress Code & Attire Guidelines

Meadowmount values an environment of mutual respect, artistry, and community. Students are expected to dress in a way that supports learning, performance, and shared spaces, while also being comfortable for summer living.

Everyday Attire (Non-Event Days)

On regular lesson, rehearsal, and practice days, summer casual attire is appropriate, including:

- Jeans, shorts, skirts
- T-shirts, casual tops
- Sandals, sneakers, and other comfortable footwear

Please note: Clothing that resembles beachwear (such as swimwear, cover-ups, or excessively revealing attire) is not appropriate in studios, classrooms, or shared indoor spaces.

Concerts & Performance Events

When attending concerts—whether as a performer or audience member—students are expected to dress in a way that reflects respect for the performers and the concert experience.

- Concert attire should be neat, intentional, and appropriate for a performance setting.
- As the summer progresses, students often choose to dress more formally in celebration of their peers' achievements—this is part of the Meadowmount tradition, and Meadowmount sparkles!

Specific performance dress requirements will be communicated separately when applicable.

Health & Sensory Considerations

- Perfume, cologne, and scented products should be avoided in shared indoor spaces, as many community members have allergies or sensitivities.

Outdoor Activities & Hiking

Students participating in hikes or outdoor activities are strongly encouraged to bring:

- Sturdy hiking boots or shoes with ankle support. This will be required for some hikes.
- Wool socks
- A rain jacket
- Long pants to protect against ticks

For local runs or walks, please pack bright-colored or reflective clothing to ensure high visibility and safety.
